2. If you are using the Grant to make improvements on County or State grounds, please include with your grant application a letter approving your project from the governing body controlling the grounds.
3. It is **MANDATORY** that you submit a detailed budget with your grant request. Please list a priority of expenditures. Each year grants received by the Board far exceed the funds available. The Board makes every effort to stretch the funds as far as possible, to as many qualified grants as possible. To achieve this goal, we have often granted the highest priority listed on the the grant application.
4. Your grant application must be postmarked or emailed by December 1, in order to be reviewed by the board.
5. Grant applications are considered in January.
6. If you are selected to receive a grant, and your project is not completed by December 1, of the calendar year in which the grant was approved, the board will request unused funds be returned to the board.
7. By December 1, a report is given to the board, explaining how the awarded grant monet was spent.
